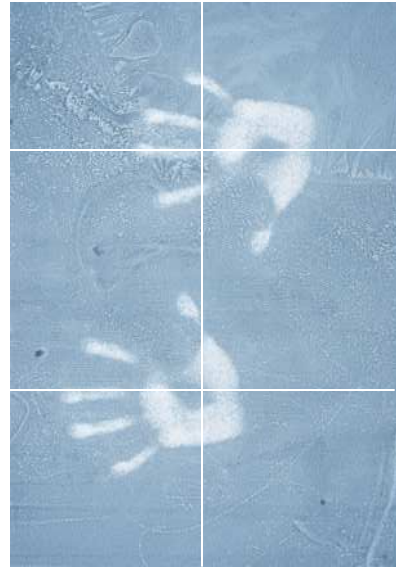

Dr. Blazar received his medical degree from Harvard in 1991 and did his postdoctoral training at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, where in 1997, he completed his fellowship in Hand, Upper Extremity and Microvascular Surgery. Since 2001 he has been an Associate Physician of Orthopaedic Surgery at Brigham and Women's Hospital and Faulkner Hospital in Massachusetts. Since 2002 he has held the title of Assistant Professor at Harvard Medical School, as well as fellowship faculty for the fellowship program in Hand Surgery. He is the recipient of numerous awards, including the "Young Leaders" program from the American Society for Surgery of the Hand.

Dr. Blazar has been an invited presenter at many regional, national and international meetings, including the annual AAOS, ASSH and FESSH meetings. He has authored, co-authored or edited papers in such peer reviewed publications as *Hand Clinics*, *Techniques of Hand and Upper Extremity Surgery* and *the Journal of Hand Surgery*.

Dr. Blazar is also actively involved in community service and education.
