#### 1. Treatment of Thumb CMC OA

Moderator: Virginia H. O'Brien, OTD, OTR/L, CHT Joy C. MacDermid, BScPT, PhD Terri L. Wolfe, OTR/L, CHT

This session will focus on the biomechanics of treatment of the painful arthritic thumb, including manual techniques and exercises to increase dynamic stability of the thumb CMC joint and the role of orthoses. The techniques covered in this session will empower therapists and patients to reduce the pain that is associated with using the thumb to pinch, pull and grasp. An overview of outcome assessment tools appropriate for this patient population will be presented.

#### 2. Hand Assessment: Where is the Evidence?

Elaine E. Fess, MS, OTR, FAOTA, CHT

This session will cover the use of standardized upper extremity assessments including tests of sensibility, dexterity, strength and hand function. Recent research regarding the correlation between handedness and grip strength will be discussed. Standardization, validity, and reliability of procedures and tests will be covered as well as the connection between clinical reasoning, treatment planning and evidence based practice.

#### 3. Orthosis Fabrication: Ulnar Sided Wrist Conditions

Moderator: David M. Wolfe, OTR/L, CHT Katie Burkhart, MS, OTR/L, CHT Meredith McCaffery, MS, OTR/L Lauren J. O'Donnell, OTR/L, CHT

This workshop will present an overview of orthotic fabrication principles and orthosis designs for ulnar sided wrist conditions such as TFCC injuries, DRUJ instability, and ECU subluxation. Participants will have the opportunity to fabricate an orthosis.

#### 4. Therapy Practice Management

This session will cover a variety of topics related to therapy practice management including coding and billing for hand therapy services, an update on orthotics reimbursement, marketing and suggestions for containing costs. #### 8. Overuse Shoulder and Elbow Injuries in the Overhead Athlete

Overuse injuries can frequently affect the overhead athlete. Understanding the biomechanical demands of the shoulder and elbow in conjunction with the kinetic chain is paramount to management of these injuries. This session will present the current best practice treatment of upper extremity overuse injuries in the athlete while focusing on the assessment, management and return to sport guidelines.

#### 9. Hand Therapy Certification Commission

This session will cover the history of hand therapy certification, scope of practice and practice analysis. The certification test blueprint and item writing process will be reviewed as well as eligibility requirements. Test preparation strategies, study groups and resources will also be covered.



#### 11. Clinical Examination of the Elbow

Clinical reasoning in the development of a treatment plan based on findings will be illustrated. Reliability and validity of the techniques will be emphasized.

### 21. Clinical Examination of the Shoulder

Martin J. Kelley, PT, DPT, OCS Brian G. Leggin, PT, DPT, OCS

This hands-on workshop will review surface anatomy, clinical evaluation of and special tests for the shoulder complex. Common shoulder pathology will be discussed in relation to physical findings. The role of the cervical spine in the production of shoulder pain will also be addressed.

### 22. Orthosis Fabrication: Static Progressive Wrist Extension Orthosis

#### 23. Arthroplasty of the PIP and DIP Joints

This session will present the indications, surgical procedures and post-operative management following arthroplasty of the MCP and PIP joints. Healing timetables, orthotic intervention and precautions will be stressed for the various procedures and implants.

#### 24. Work Capacity Evaluation

Functional Capacity Evaluation provides essential objective information as a basis for work simulation programs and return to work. The participants will learn techniques to determine safe function and predict an individual's readiness to return to work. The evaluation of the upper extremity physical demands and techniques for meaningful reporting will be emphasized.

### 25. Key Concepts for Mobilizing the Stiff Hand

Judy C. Colditz, OTR/L, CHT

This workshop will explore our current state-of-the-art, evidence-based rationale for treating stiffness in the hand. Common myths of treating stiffness will be discussed and evidence for central concepts such as ideal mobilization approaches, duration of treatment and the role of intrinsic muscle tightness will be considered. This information will be applied to the biomechanics of each joint of the hand, as relevant treatment approaches specific to each joint are discussed.

#### 26. Differentiation of Upper Limb Neurogenic Pain


