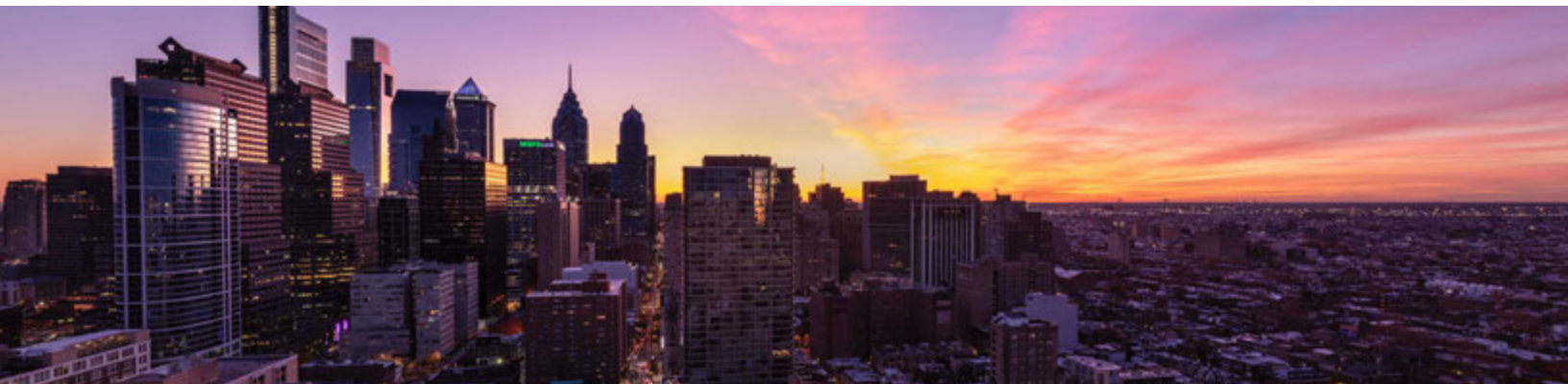

1. Orthosis Fabrication: Trigger Finger Orthosis

2. Orthosis Fabrication; Creative Solutions for PIP Flexion Contracture and Swan Neck Deformities
